A panel of external experts assisted the Executive Agency in the evaluation of your application against the award criteria indicated in the Call for Proposals. Please take into account the fact that most of the evaluation reports were written by non-native speakers. The Executive Agency will not elaborate further on these assessments.



[537672]The CLIL4U project plans to assist the implementation of CLIL in primary schools and vocational colleges by producing: 6 promotional videos showing CLIL used in classes; 48 CLIL scenarios; an online collection of materials and linked to resources; advisory materials to be used for including parents of primary school children in the CLIL process; and teacher courses, tests and certifications.

The application falls within the scope of KA2-Languages and clearly addresses the priority "Support for partially or fully bilingual education", as it intends to provide both teacher training and CLIL materials implementation and testing. Transversality is assured, as target groups include school pupils and students from the vocational education sector.

Challenges addressed by the project are well described and its objectives are clearly defined. The application offers a well-planned, focused response to the issue identified in several reports of the lack of training and support materials for institutions and teachers wishing to start and develop CLIL.

Quality of the work programme

[537672]The CLIL4U Work Programme (organised into 11 work packages over 30 months) is logical and has been carefully planned to achieve the project objectives described. Milestones and intermediate quality indicators are clearly described and related to the progress of the project. Concrete measures for the evaluation of processes and deliverables are foreseen, and it is interesting that the external evaluators have to engage with the project activities for relatively long periods. Project management mechanisms are well-defined, transparent and appropriate for planned project activities and outcomes. Work package deliverables have been particularly well-described with

activities and outcomes. Work package deliverables have been particularly well-described with numbers, formats, target audience and languages clearly defined. Tasks are distributed among partners according to their expertise (in the primary, vocational and teacher training sectors), and experience with CLIL.

Innovative character

[537672]The application presents an interesting overview of the context about the implementation of CLIL initiatives in Europe and synthesises the results of some significant, recent, EU-funded projects in the domain. However, it does not take into consideration some scientific accounts of the achievements and constraints regarding CLIL implementation, for instance focusing on the balance between lesser used and international languages in multilingual contexts.

The project's plan to produce multilingual resources which can be used freely is an innovative and practical response to the problem of resourcing, setting up and teacher training in support of CLIL. The proposal builds on the LdV POOLS-T (141783-LLP-1-2008-1-DK-LEONARDO-LMP) and POOLS-M (LLP-LdV-ToI-2009/DK-902) projects. It also plans to use links through the on-going TOOLS (517543-LLP-2011-DK-KA2-KA2MP) project to enlarge contacts with CLIL communities. There is no overlap in activity but a clearly described synergy in using techniques and expertise developed in the POOLS projects in the service of the outcomes of CLIL4U.

Targeting stakeholders from parents of children learning through CLIL to practising teachers, and making outcomes available online, in a range of formats is a comprehensive holistic solution. Planned dissemination and validation activities are particularly open and forward-looking in their use of social media and online videos to spread information about the project while up-skilling those involved in the process.

Quality of the Consortium

[537672]The consortium consists of 8 partners representing 6 countries, all with previous experience in CLIL projects and language teaching, and with many examples of collaborating situations between them. The partners represent various types of organisations and education sectors (primary, vocational, teacher training), and come from countries with different degrees of CLIL implementation. Target languages of the project are Danish, English, Greek, Italian, Maltese and Spanish, all covered by partners established in countries where these languages are recognised as official.

Partners' roles in the project have been meticulously planned and the expertise brought by each individual is well documented. Tasks and budget have been appropriately shared between all partners in the consortium.

The partnership brings several types of skills to the table, and there is ample evidence that it possesses the expertise and competence to carry out the work programme efficiently, effectively and professionally. Also, as the outcomes will directly benefit all partners, they have intrinsic motivation to do so with a sense of common ownership and responsibility.

European added value

[537672]It is certain that CLIL initiatives need European-level perspectives and the project builds on trans-national and trans-sectoral collaborations. The application shows this collaborative dimension well, with the exploitation of good practices throughout Europe. Nevertheless, the so-called European-wide partnership of the project (p. 27 of the application) is a relative one; languages represented in the consortium are not so numerous, as there are two partners from Malta, two from Denmark and two other from Italian-speaking regions. In addition, Central and Eastern European countries are not represented in the consortium.

Overall, the proposal demonstrates a comprehensive strategy and adequate planned activities to support the widespread adoption of the CLIL outcomes and to increase the application of CLIL, not just through the specified project deliverables. The project plans to use and support European initiatives such as the Bologna Process, the CEFR and the Languages Portfolio in its activities (e.g. referencing CEFR in materials and placement tests) which supports EU-wide transparency.

The cost-benefit ratio

[537672]CLIL4U requests a 392.000 Euro grant for a 30-month project with total project cost of 522.000€. The budget is generally coherent and consistent with the work programme, as the application provides all necessary details related to the project's activities.

There is a comprehensive plan of control and monitoring of the expenditure which is crucial for this relatively large consortium. Several measures are foreseen in order to assure the most economical solutions, regarding for example the decisions taken about travel and subsistence. Nevertheless, this section of the budget covers no less than 21% of the requested grant, and probably one of the project meetings could be avoided and replaced by online arrangements.

Staffing costs across the partners and work packages have been meticulously calculated and costed. Equipment costs are justified and depreciation rates calculated accurately. Sub-contracting costs (for the video producer and external quality assurance) are justified and reasonable. As targets for project outcomes (numbers of resources, languages, and participants) are well defined it is possible to be confident that CLIL4U demonstrates an effective use of resources and represents good value for money. There is no provision in the budget for the required external audit certificate.

Impact

[537672]Some important objectives of KA2-Languages are in the heart of the proposed project, but target groups of the project are identified in a vague way, as "language teachers and their pupils/students from Comenius and Leonardo sectors". This is not clear enough and the needs of such generally defined groups are very hard to assess and analyse.

Nevertheless, the application gives very precise indications of the end-users during the lifetime of the project: 120 teachers, 360 pupils and 440 students will use and test the developed materials. Furthermore, there is a scale effect in the process of the implementation of the project (first, people from the participant institutions, then from the region, then from the country and so on), which is usually effective in these kind of projects.

The clarity of planning and background work which has gone into this proposal, along with the exploitation of the communication and dissemination channels suggested in the application, gives confidence that CLIL4U will have a positive influence not only on the partners and users of the CLIL4U resources, but for the field of CLIL across Europe.

[537672]Different modes of dissemination to reach the diverse groups of wider stakeholders interested, or potentially interested in the project have been well thought through and explained. These include online provision via facebook, twitter, the project website, vimeo and ebooks, through conference participation and in print, and exploitation of existing networks (EUROCALL, EfVET). Specific examples and links for each of these modes have been researched and included in the proposal.

The vested interest that all partners (funded and associated) have for CLIL4U to be successful is a positive factor in quality assurance, dissemination and sustainability of results. There is provision for the CLIL4U courses to continue to be offered after the funded period, with support from a clearly defined list of networks and associated partners in all partner countries. All project outcomes will be 'CopyLeft' and may be used by any institution.

It would be useful though, to differentiate actions at local and national level, as the partner countries do not have the same use and tradition of electronic and conventional media, nor experience in CLIL implementation in their educational institutions.
